Euro 2012 was very positive in terms of refereeing.

February 2010 UEFA Executive Committee appointed a UEFA Chief Refereeing Officer and two Refereeing Officers Their task is:

- ✓ To coordinate the activity of the UEFA Referees Committee
- ✓ Fix the UEFA refereeing technical strategy
- ✓ Prepare and appoint referees for UEFA competitions.



✓ Introductory Course for new UEFA referees
 Summer Course for UEFA top categories referees before the start of UCL/UEL group phase (Sept. 3rd – 5th in Nyon)
 ✓ Advanced Course for UEFA top categories referees before the start of UCL/UEL knock out phase (beginning of February, after winter pause)

Tactical preparation

For a long time referees were interested in knowing the Laws of the Game only:


 $\checkmark\,$ "I'm a referee and a match is a match. I don't care to know something else other than the Laws of the Game"

Now referees are encouraged to know everything about the match they are going to officiate:

- ✓ Different shapes applied (3-4-3, 4-2-3-1, 4-4-2) as play could flow very differently.
- ✓ Offensive & defensive tactics at set pieces (blocks)
- ✓ Players' characteristics
- ✓ Offside tactic (for assistant referees)

Additional Assistant referees: the main goal

"Everyone agrees on the need to help referees. With football getting ever faster and the players ever fitter, it sometimes seems the men in black face a mission impossible. Two extra pairs of eyes focusing on the penalty areas are of valuable assistance to the referee and strengthen the referee team in confidence and numbers, while allowing the game to flow."


The main goal of having two more match officials involved in the match is to give the referee support in taking decisions when something occurs in and around the penalty area



- ✓ More respect of the Laws of the Game by players
- ✓ Higher accuracy of the Assistant Referees' decisions

Since 2012, July 5th AAR are part of the Laws of the Game and every Confederation and/or National Association is free to use them in their competitions.
